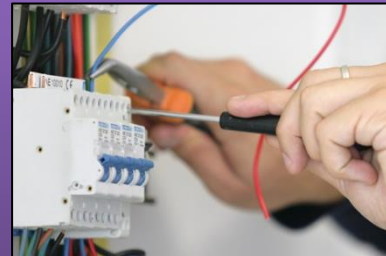

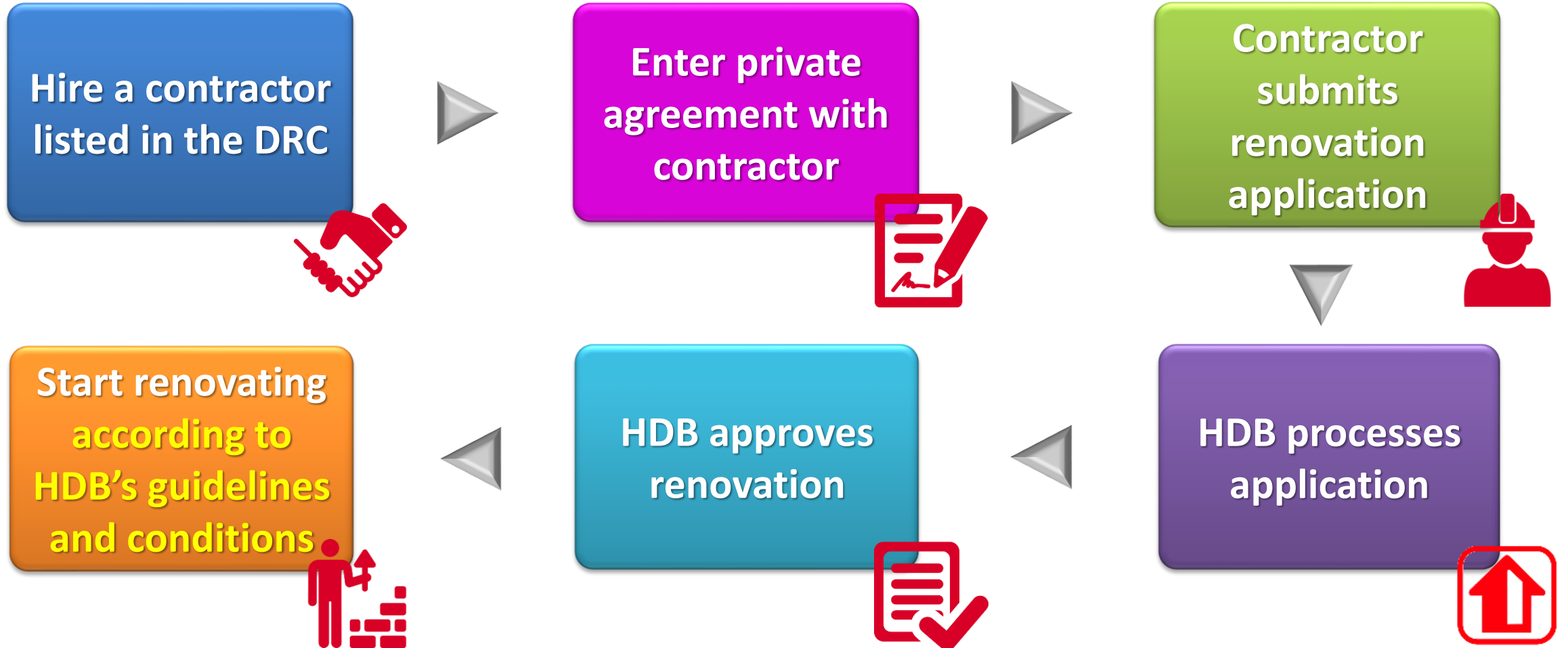

Raising floor level by more than 50mm (inclusive of floor tiles) with screed

SINGAPORE - Around 190 home owners and contractors of Housing Board flats were found to have carried out unauthorised renovation works infringing on the HDB's guidelines in the past three years.

More than 38,000 flats were inspected by the HDB from 2018 to 2020. Of these, less than 0.5 per cent of flats were found to be in breach of the guidelines.

Unauthorised works had to be reinstated

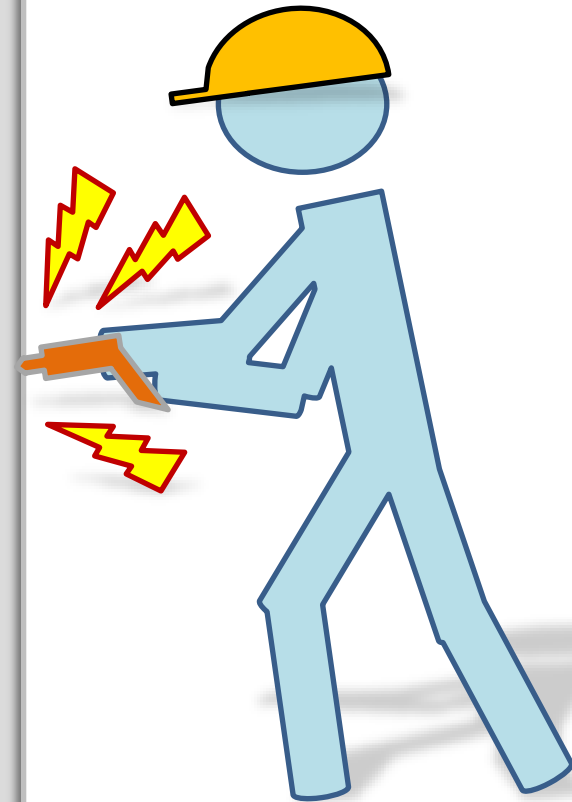

Renovating responsibly

Any contractor of your choice!

- E.g. Carpentry installation, fixing lights and ceiling fans
- May not be aware of HDB's guidelines on working hours
- Need to be separately informed of working timings
- Be a good neighbour and do your part – inform the contractor to give advanced notice!



Renovating responsibly

TIP: DIY works by flat owner

- E.g. Fixing hammering a nail, drilling holes for fittings, sawing materials
- Inform your neighbours in advance too
- Especially if carrying out the works outside of the usual renovation timings and days!



Renovating responsibly

Remind your contractors to:

- Use the lifts properly
- Dispose of waste material at appropriate locations
- Keep all works to permitted timings
- Inform neighbours in advance of renovations
- Display notice of renovation outside the flat

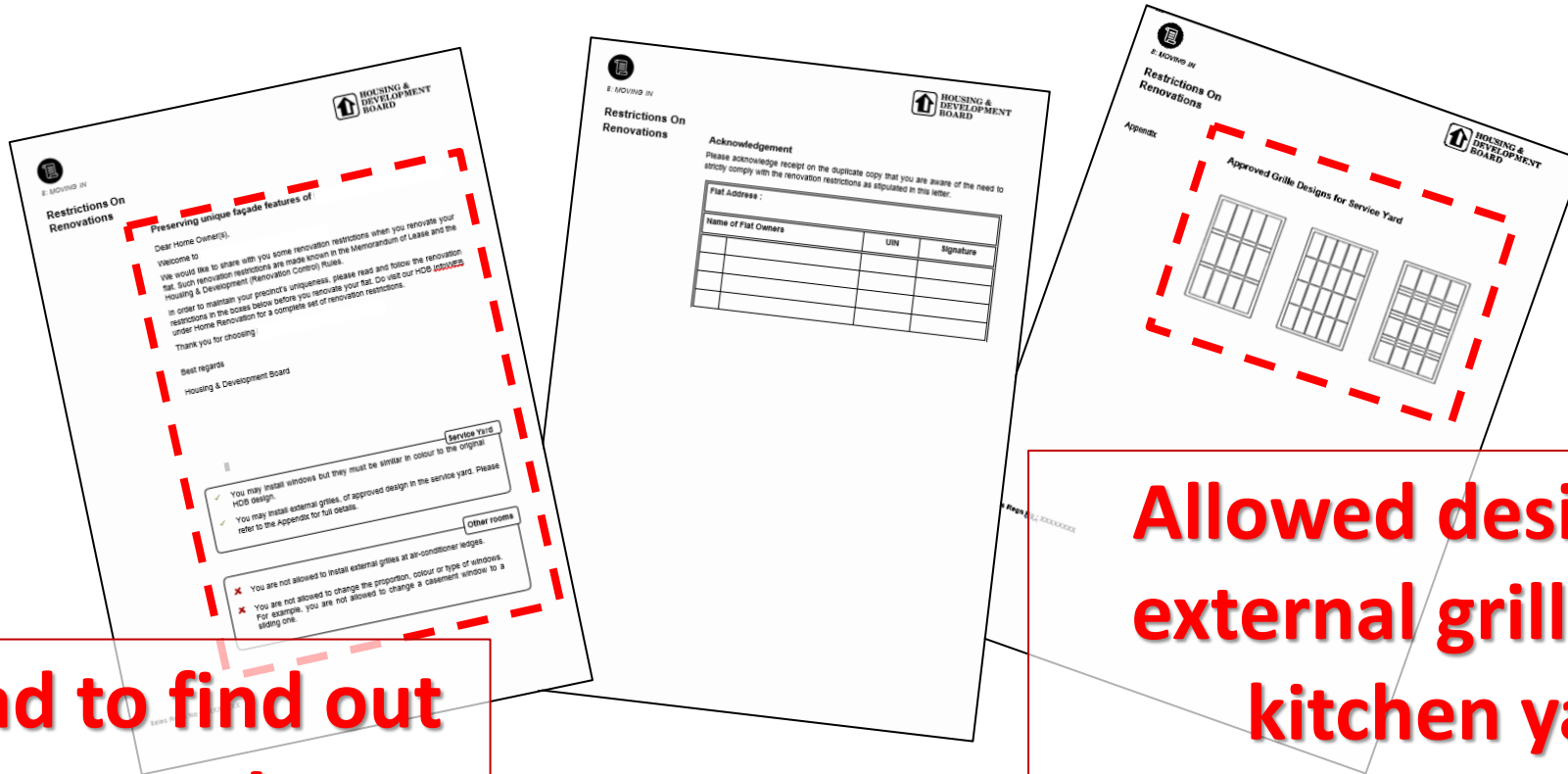

Specific guidelines!

Location	Renovation Restrictions
Service Yard	You may install windows but they must be similar in colour to the original HDB design. You may install external grilles, of approved design .
Air-conditioner Ledge	You are not allowed to install external grilles.
Other Rooms	You are not allowed to change the type of windows, the proportion or colour. For example, you are not allowed to change a casement window to a sliding one.

You can refer to the rest of our **renovation restrictions** which are applicable to all flats, for other works such as building, electrical, gas, or plumbing.

What homeowners should do to avoid such situations?

1. Look for **Reputable** renovation companies
 - ✓ HDB's Directory of Renovation Contractors
 - ✓ ACRA Registered
2. Conduct background checks
 - Ensure the company has a **paid-up capital** of \$50k and above. You need to exercise prudence when dealing with a low capitalised company.
3. Research on past projects done and customer reviews
 - Nothing's better than **actual reviews from homeowners**. Social media is one of the popular platforms where you can look at not just reviews, but also the company's recent or past project works done.
4. Be careful about **Massive Upfront** deposits
 - NEVER** pay the full amount for your renovation even before any commencement of work. If it's the interior designers that requested for the upfront payment, do contact the company's management to clarify. Also, check if the company has any payment schedule.

LAMINATES
Laminate countertops used to be extremely popular a few decades back. It's made by compressing layers of paper and melamine resin, creating a thin yet strong material that's lightweight. Some of the biggest advantages of laminates include its price, aesthetics and simplicity of installation.

- Low maintenance, easy to clean and waterproof
- High quality laminates are resistant to bacteria
- New technology makes some laminates resistant to scratches, burns and stains
- Difficult to repair if damaged
- Wide range of patterns and textures, including stone and wood lookalikes

ALTERNATIVE MATERIALS

Over the years, alternative countertop materials are making themselves known to the modern kitchen. Some might be more unconventional than others, but they all have their pros and cons.



KOMPACPLUS
This relatively new material is made from, essentially, paper pulp soaked with resin. Multiple layers form dense, thick panels that are lightweight but extremely durable and resistant.



ALUMINIUM/STEEL
Metals in the kitchen are more often seen in industrial kitchens, but can look quite at home in the home. Aluminium and steel are sleek, durable and extremely resistant to bacteria. They're also surprisingly simple to clean and maintain.



TILES
Although uncommon, some homeowners use large format tiles in place of the traditional kitchen countertop. This is an arguably aesthetic decision, as it may be more difficult to clean and maintain.
